STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend the Charter of the Maine Water Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Whenever the Maine Water Company, as

- 2 authorized by its charter, or by the charter of the Bath
- 3 Water Supply Company, shall lay and maintain its water
- 4 pipes over the bed of the Kennebec river between the
- 5 city of Bath and the town of Woolwich, for the purpose
- 6 of supplying the city of Bath with pure water, all per-
- 7 sons shall be liable in damages for any injuries done by
- 8 them to said water pipes, and such damages may be-
- 9 recovered in an action upon the case brought by the
- 10 Maine Water Company. Section's of the charter of said

- 11 Bath Water Supply Company, shall also apply in full
- 12 force to any wilful injury to said water pipes so laid upon
- 13 the bed of the Kennebec river.
 - SECT. 2. The location of said water pipes over the bed
 - 2 of the river shall be plainly defined by notices posted on
 - 3 either bank, with warning to vessels and water craft not
 - 4 to anchor within 500 feet of the location of said pipes.
 - 5 Any person who shall wilfully anchor a vessel or other
 - 6 water craft within 500 feet of the location of said water
- 7 pipes, shall be subject, on conviction thereof, to the pen-
- 8 alty provided in said section 8 of the charter of the said
- 9 Bath Water Supply Company.
- SECT. 3. The city of Bath and the town of Woolwich,
- 2 shall each make and enforce all reasonable by-laws and
- 3 regulations for the protection of said water pipes and pro-
- 4 vide appropriate penalties for the violation of them.
 - SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
