STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to provide for the Education of Scholars living at
any light station not embraced within the limits of any
school district.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. Any person between the age of five and
2 twenty-one years living at any light station not embraced
3 within the limits of any school district shall be admitted
4 to any public school in this State without paying tuition.

SECT. 2. Such scholars shall be entitled to all privileges
2 and benefits and be subject to the same conditions, rules
3 and regulations as scholars residing in the district in which
4 they attend school.

SECT. 3. All acts and parts of acts not consistent here-
2 with are hereby repealed.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
