STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend Chapter 401 of the Private Laws of
1885, entitled “An Act granting additional power to the
inhabitants of School District No. 5 in the Town of
Kennebunk.”

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows.*

SECTION 1. Chapter 401 of the Private Laws of the
2 State of Maine for the year 1885, entitled “An Act
3 granting additional power to the inhabitants of School
4 District No. 5 in the town of Kennebunk,” is hereby
5 amended as follows :

In section 6 after the word “shall” at the end of the
7 first line shall be inserted the words, ‘be appointed by the
8 assessors to hold office for one year unless sooner removed

9 by such assessors or their successors and shall', so that
10 said section 6 shall read :

‘Section 6. Said police officers and night watchmen
12 shall be appointed by the assessors to hold office for one
13 year unless sooner removed by such assessors or their
14 successors and shall have, within the limits of said dis-
15 trict, the powers of constables in matters criminal or
16 relating to the by-laws of said district or of the town of
17 Kennebunk.’

SECT. 2. This amendment shall take effect upon its
2 adoption by a majority vote of said district at a meeting
3 legally called therefor.
