STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to make valid the organization of the Gilman Falls
Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECTION 1. The organization of the Gilman Falls Com-
2 pany, as made under the general laws of the State of
3 Maine on the fourteenth day of July, in the year of our
4 Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, is
5 hereby made valid, and said company is hereby declared
6 to be a body corporate duly organized under said laws.

SECT. 2. The meeting of the stockholders of said com-
2 pany held on the twelfth day of August, in the year of
3 our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety, is hereby
4 declared to be a legal meeting of said stockholders, and

5 the acts of said stockholders at said meeting are hereby
6 given full force and effect.

SECT. 3. A record of the doings of the first meeting
2 of the associates forming and organizing said corporation,
3 and of all meetings of said corporation held prior to the
4 fourteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one
5 thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, may be extended
6 upon the records of said corporation by the clerk thereof
7 from any attainable minutes of such meetings; and such
8 extended record, when duly certified by the clerk of said
9 corporation as made from such minutes, and when
10 approved by the stockholders of said corporation at a
11 meeting held under a notice specifying such approval as
12 one of the subjects to be acted upon, shall be deemed a
13 true record thereof, and have all the force and effect which
14 it would have had if made and signed by the clerk of
15 said company at the time said several meetings were held.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
