## STATE OF MAINE.

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to amend Section thirty-four of Chapter fifty-one of the Revised Statutes, relating to Crossings.

 $B_{\ell}$  it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section thirty-four of chapter fifty-one of the Revised 2 Statutes is hereby amended by substituting the word 3 'railroad' for the word 'county" in the fifth line thereof, 4 so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

Section 34. When the municipal officers of a town
6 deem it necessary, for public safety, that gates should be
7 erected across a way where it is crossed by a railroad,
8 and that a person should be appointed to open and close
9 them, they may make such request in writing; and in
10 case of neglect or refusal, they may apply to the railroad.

- 11 commissioners to decide upon the reasonableness of such
- 12 request, who, after notice and hearing, shall decide.

When they decide that such a request is reasonable, or 14 that at said crossing a flagman is necessary for the public 15 safety, they may, upon said application, order a flagman 16 to be stationed there, instead of gates, and the corpora-17 tion shall comply with such order and pay the costs; 18 when they decide otherwise, the costs shall be paid by 19 the applicants.'
