STATE OF MAINE.

AMENDMENT "A" to "Resolve in favor of the Normal and Madawaska Training Schools of Maine," House Document No. 164.

Amend by striking out the word "for" in the fourth line and the words "this purpose," in the fifth line; and all after the word "dollars" in the fifth line and adding thereafter the following: 'Be and hereby is appropriated to be used, or such part thereof as is necessary for that purpose. In case of loss or damage by fire of any of said buildings the said trustees shall have authority, under the direction of the governor and council, to use the moneys received on account of such insurance, or such part thereof as is necessary, to repair or rebuild the said buildings; but said moneys shall he used for no other purpose.' So that said resolve as amended shall read as follows:

- ·Resolved, That the board of trustees of the Normal and
- 2 Madawaska Training schools be authorized to effect a
- 3 reasonable insurance on the interest of the State in the

- 4 buildings and other property in said schools and that the
- 5 sum of one thousand dollars be and hereby is appropri-
- 6 ated, to be used or such part thereof as is necessary for
- 7 that purpose. In case of loss or damage by fire of any
- 8 of said buildings, the said trustees shall have authority,
- 9 under the direction of the governor and council, to
- 10 use the moneys received on account of any such insurance,
- 11 or such part thereof as is necessary to repair or rebuild
- 12 the said buildings, but said moneys shall be used for no
- 13 other purpose.'
