STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT to Incorporate the Maine Sportsmen's Fish and Game Association.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- 36 together with their associates and successors, all citizens
- 37 of the State of Maine, by and hereby are constituted a
- 38 body corporate and politic by the name of the Maine
- 39 Sportsmen's Fish and Game Association, for the purpose
- 40 of assisting in the preservation of our forests and the
- 41 prevention of forest fires, in the protection of the fur,
- 42 fish and game of the State, in their propagation and in
- 43 the enforcement of the fur, fish and game laws; in the

- 44 publishing and distributing of valuable information for
- 45 the benefit of all classes of our citizens, so that they will
- 46 become better qualified to judge and understand their
- 47 rights and wants, thereby securing their sympathy and
- 48 confidence, for the purpose of aiding the State in the
- 49 enforcement of the laws relating thereto; to have and
- 50 use a seal; to make and enforce by-laws for the manage-
- 51 ment of its financial and other affairs, not inconsistent
- 52 with the laws of the State.
 - SECT. 2. The first meeting of the association to be held
 - 2 in Augusta, Me., for organization, and may be called by
 - 3 any five of the corporators, on written notice to all of
 - 4 the other corporators and associates, stating the time and
- 5 place of meeting, five days at least before the day named
- 6 therefor.
 - The annual meetings of the years of the session of the
- 8 Legislature shall be held in Augusta, Maine, on the first
- 9 Tuesday of January, for the election of officers, which
- 10 shall be by ballot, and for the transaction of all other bus-
- 11 iness that may properly come before the meeting; (other
- 12 meetings to be provided for in the by-laws;) the off
- 13 years in Bangor, Maine, or otherwise, as a majority of
- 14 the association may determine.
 - SECT. 3. The capital stock of said association shall be
- 2 twenty-five thousand dollars, divided into shares of ten
- 3 dollars each, said capital stock may be increased by vote
- 4 of the association.
 - SECT. 4. This association may acquire, take by pur-
- 2 chase, gift, grant or otherwise, real and personal property,
- 3 to hold and improve the same; occupy any lands for the
- 4 use of the association, owned by the State, by gift from

- 5 or by lease, as the governor and council may determine;
- 6 such property of the association as is used for, or the pro-
- 7 ceeds of, expended for the protection and propagation of
- 8 fur, fish and game, shall be fixed at one dollar per year.
 - Sect. 5. The association shall have the power to pros-
 - 2 ecute and defend suits at law, construct hatcheries for
 - 3 the propagation of both shore and inland fish and with
 - 4 the consent and under the supervision of the fish and
 - 5 game commissioners of the State, construct dams and
 - 6 fishways, screen outlets leading to large rivers to prevent
 - 7 the sluicing of fish from waters that are being stocked
 - 8 with fish, to provide suitable grounds, erect buildings
 - 9 for the use of the association, establish safe and perma-
- 10 nent gun, rifle and revolver ranges for the practice of
- 11 both military and sporting arms.
- Sect. 6. Said association may issue bonds for the con-
- 2 struction of its works upon such rates, terms and time as
- 3 it may deem proper and expedient, not exceeding in
- 4 amount its capital stock, and secure the same by mortgage
- 5 on property of the association.
- SECT. 7. No stockholder of the association, his family,
- 2 relatives or all combined, shall hold stock and bonds in
- 3 amount exceeding one one-hundredth part of the entire
- 4 issue, except the one share each of stock that constitutes
- 5 the membership fee, and any stock and bonds in excess
- 6 of the said amount is hereby forfeited to the association.
 - Sect. 8. The governor and council may each year ap-
- 2 point one member of the associations board of directors,
- 3 from the then existing members of the council.
 - SECT. 9. The membership fee of the association shall
 - 2 be the subscribing and paying for one share of the capital

- 3 stock of the association, the par value of which shall be
- 4 ten dollars. All stock subscribed and paid for by mem-
- 5 bers, shall be held in trust by the association, and for-
- 6 feited to the association on failure of payment of the
- 7 annual dues, which shall not exceed five dollars for each
- 8 year; provided, however, that the failure to pay the
- 9 annual dues shall not work a forfeiture of the stock, if
- 10 said dues are paid on or before the date of the annual
- 11 meeting of the association.
 - SECT. 10. Whenever the association fails to maintain
 - 2 its organization for the purposes set forth in its charter,
 - 3 the properties of said association shall be forfeited to the
 - 4 State, except so much thereof as is represented by the
- 5 par value of the capital stock owned by such members as
- 6 are in good standing in the association; and the governor
- 7 and council is hereby empowered with authority to pro-
- 8 ceed upon investigation, against the property of the
- 9 association, disposing of the same, and paying to the
- 10 members in good standing, as above set forth, and turn-
- 11 ing over the excess of all moneys to the State treasury,
- 12 to be credited to the appropriation for the use of the fish
- 13 and game commissioners of the State.

SECT. 11. This act shall take effect when approved.
