STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT in relation to the Inspection of Milk.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 44 of chapter 38 of the Revised

- 2 Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the first two
- 3 lines of said section and inserting in place thereof the
- 4 following: 'The municipal officers of cities and towns
- 5 containing not less than three thousand inhabitants shall
- 6 annually appoint, and the municipal officers of all other
- 7 towns shall on application of ten voters therein,' so that
- 8 said section as amended shall read as follows:
- 'Section 44. The municipal officers of cities and towns
- 10 containing not less than three thousand inhabitants shall
- 11 annually appoint, and the municipal officers of all other
- 12 towns shall on application of ten voters therein annually

- 13 appoint one or more persons to be inspectors of milk,
- 14 who shall, before entering upon their duties, be sworn,
- 15 and give notice of their appointment by publishing the
- 16 same for two weeks in a newspaper published in their
- 17 towns, if any, otherwise by posting such notice in two
- 18 or more public places therein.'
 - SECT. 2. Section 47 of chapter 38 of the Revised
 - 2 Statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the words
 - 3 "has been added" in the fifth, line, the words for sells or
 - 4 offers for sale as pure milk any milk from which cream
 - 5 has been taken; and also by adding, after the word
- 6 "indictment," in the last line of said section, the words
- 7 'when milk shall, by the gravimetric analysis, be found
- 8 to contain over eighty-eight per cent of water, it shall be
- 9 deemed prima facie evidence that said milk has been
- 10 watered; and when milk, by the analysis aforesaid shall
- 11 be found to contain less than twelve per cent of solids
- ,12 and less than three per cent of fat, it shall be deemed,
- 13 prima facie, milk from which cream has been taken, and
- 14 any milk which, by the analysis aforesaid, shall be found
 - 15 to contain any foreign substance shall be deemed milk to
- 116 which a foreign substance has been added;' so that said
- 17 section, as amended, shall read as follows:
 - 'Section 47. Whoever acting for himself, or as the
 - 19 employe of another knowingly or wilfully sells or offers
 - 20 for sale, milk from cows diseased, sick, or fed upon the
 - 21 refuse of breweries or distilleries, or upon any substance
 - 22 deleterious to its quality, or milk to which water or any
 - 23 foreign substance has been added, or sells or offers for
 - 24 sale as pure milk any milk from which cream has been
 - 25 taken, forfeits twenty dollars for the first and fifty dollars

2 6	for every subsequent offence, to be recovered for the town
27	where the offence is committed, by complaint and indict-
2 8	ment. When milk shall, by the gravimetric analysis
2 9	be found to contain over eighty-eight per cent of water,
30	it shall be deemed prima facie evidence that said milk
31	has been watered, and when milk, by the analysis afore-
32	said, shall be found to contain less than twelve per cent
33	of solids and less than three per cent of fat, it shall be
34	deemed, prima facie, milk from which cream has been
35	taken, and any milk which, by the analysis aforesaid,
3 6	shall be found to contain any foreign substance shall be
37	deemed milk to which a foreign substance has been added.
	SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
