STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Isaac D. Fuller of Buckfield.

Resolved, That hereafter there be paid out of the treasury of the State to Isaac D. Fuller of Buckfield, the sum of twenty-four dollars per month as a military pension, during the pleasure of the legislature, commencing January one, eighteen hundred and ninety-three, the above pension being in lieu of all State aid.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Isaac D. Fuller was a member of the 23rd and 30th Regiments of Maine Volunteers in the Army of the Rebellion and was honorably discharged from same. Six years ago the fourth of last July while engaged in firing a salute, by premature discharge of the gun had both of his arms blown away, thereby being entirely disabled from doing manual labor. His family consists of a wife and one child dependent on him for their maintenance and support. Within six months his wife has had a rheumatic fever leaving her a cripple for life requiring constant care and attention. Mr. Fuller has no means of his own, and unless this pension is granted will be a subject of public or private charity.
