STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT authorizing and requiring the Inspector of Factories, Workshops, Mines and Quarries to enforce the laws relating to fortnightly payments, sanitary conditions of factories, and to require him to report annually.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows.

Section 1. It shall be the duty of the inspector of

- 2 factories, workshops, mines and quarries, upon complaint,
- 3 to inquire into, and prosecute for, any violations of chap-
- 4 ter one hundred and thirty-four of the Public Laws of
- 5 eighteen hundred and eighty-seven.
 - SECT. 2. It shall be the duty of the inspector of fac-
- 2 tories, workshops, mines and quarries to examine into the
- 3 sanitary condition of factories, workshops, mines and

- 4 quarries, and when any condition or thing is found that,
- 5 in his opinion, endangers the health or lives of the
- 6 employes he shall notify the local board of health, and it
- 7 shall be the duty of said board to investigate the matter.
 - Sect. 3. It shall be the duty of the inspector of fac-
- 2 tories, workshops, mines and quarries to enforce the due
- 3 observance of sections twenty-five and twenty-six of chap-
- 4 ter twenty-six of the Revised Statutes of eighteen hundred
- 5 and eighty-three, relating to the swinging of doors in all
- 6 factories and workshops.
 - Sect. 4. The inspector of factories, workshops, mines
- 2 and quarries shall, on or before the first day of December
- 3 annually, submit his report to the commissioner of indus-
- 4 trial and labor statistics which shall be incorporated in,
- 5 and printed with, the annual report of the bureau of
- 6 industrial and labor statistics.
- SECT. 5. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent here-
- 2 with are hereby repealed.
 - Sect. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.
