STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-THREE.

AN ACT for the better protection of trout in Mud Pond,
so called, in Township two, Range four, Franklin
County.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. No person shall take, kill, catch, or fish
2 for, any trout, or any other fish in Mud pond, in township
3 two, range four, in Franklin county, between the first days
4 of October and May following, in each year.

SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of this
2 act, shall be liable to a fine of not more than ten dollars
3 for each offense, and a further fine of one dollar for each
4 fish so taken to be recovered before any trial justice in
5 Franklin county, one-half to the complainant and one-half
6 to the county of Franklin.
