SENATE AMENDMENT "A" TO HOUSE DOCU-MENT No. 96.

Amend the title by adding the words 'and other infectious diseases' after the word "Cholera;" so that the title as amended shall read as follows:

'An Act to provide for the prevention of the introduction and spread of Asiatic Cholera and other Infectious Diseases, and for the more effective protection of the public health.'

SENATE AMENDMENT "B" TO HOUSE DOCUMENT No. 96.

Amend section one as follows: In the fifth line after the words "Asiatic cholera" insert the words "small-pox, diphtheria, scarlet fever, or typhus fever."

In the ninth, twenty-second, twenty sixth, thirty-first, and forty-sixth lines strike out the words "Asiatic cholera" and in place thereof insert the words 'said diseases.'

In the thirtieth, thirty-third, and thirty-fourth lines strike out the word "disease" and insert in the place thereof the plural of this word, 'diseases;' so that this section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. The more effectually to protect the public 2 health the State Board of Health shall have power to 3 establish such systems of inspection as in its judgment 4 may be necessary to ascertain the actual or threatened 5 presence of the infection of Asiatic cholera, small-pox, 6 diphtheria, scarlet fever, or typhus fever; and any duly 7 authorized agent or inspector of said board shall have 8 power to enter any building, vessel, railway car, or other 9 public vehicle, to inspect the same and to remove there-10 from any person affected by said diseases; and for this purpose he may require the person in charge of any vessel or public vehicle other than a railway car to stop such vessel or vehicle at any place, and he may require the conductor of any railway train to stop his train at any station or upon any sidetrack and there detain it for a reasonable time; provided that no conductor shall be required to stop his train when telegraphic communication with the despatcher's office cannot be obtained or at such times or under such circumstances as may endanger the safety of the train and passengers; and provided further that any such agent or inspector may cause any car which he may think may be infetsed with said diseases 23 to be sidetracked at any suitable place and there be cleansed, fumigated and disinfected. And the said board of health may from time to time make, alter, modify or revoke rules and regulations for guarding against the 27 introduction of said diseases into the State; for the con28 trol and suppression thereof if within the State; for the 29 quarantine and disinfection of persons, localities, and 30 things infected or suspected of being infected by such dis-31 eases; for the transportation of dead bodies when death 32 resulted from said diseases; for the speedy and private 33 interment of the bodies of persons who have died from 34 said diseases; and, in emergency, for providing those 35 sick with said diseases with necessary medical aid 36 and with temporary hospitals for their accommo-37 dation and for the accommodation of their nurses and 38 attendants. And the said board may declare any and all 39 of its rules and regulations made in accordance 40 with the provisions of this act to be in force within the 41 whole State, or within any specified part thereof, and to 42 apply to any vessel, railway car, or public vehicle of any 43 kind. The rules and regulations of the State board of 44 health, if of general application, shall be published in the 45 official paper of the State; but whenever in the judgment 46 of the board it shall be necessary to do so, special rules and regulations, or orders relating to said diseases may 48 be made for any town, village or city without such publi-49 cation and the service of copies of such rules, regulations, 50 or orders upon such town, village or city through the 51 officers thereof shall be a sufficient notice thereto; and 52 the rules, regulations or orders of the State board of health made in accordance with the provisions of this act 54 shall, from the time being and until the same are revoked, 55 supersede all local rules, regulations, by-laws, or ordi-56 nances that may be inconsistent or in conflict therewith.'
