STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE to provide for the Insane of the State.

Resolved, That the Governor with the advice and consent of the Council shall appoint a board of five commissioners, whose duty it shall be to investigate the present capacity of the insane hospital at Augusta, and as to the needs of further accommodation for the care of the insane of this State, and whether a new hospital shall be built in the city of Bangor, on the site provided for by the commission appointed under chapter 207 of the resolves of the Legislature of 1889, and also to inquire what kind of buildings, whether of pavilion, cottage or other plan, are necessary to be built at said Bangor for the accommodation of the insane patients, and said commissioners are also hereby authorized to investigate as to

14 the most improved plans and models for such buildings,
15 and the amount of appropriation necessary for said new
16 hospital, and report their doings to the next legislature ;
17 and the sum of fifty thousand dollars is hereby appro-
18 priated to carry out the provisions of this resolve to be
19 paid by the State Treasurer on warrants drawn by the
20 Governor and Council, and said commissioners are
21 hereby authorized to cause to be expended so much of
22 said fifty thousand dollars as is, in their judgment,
23 necessary to repair the buildings at the present insane
24 hospital at Augusta until such new hospital is built ; the
25 balance to be retained for the purpose of the new hospi-
26 tal at Bangor. Said commissioners shall receive for
27 compensation for their services and all necessary ex-
28 penses incurred while so employed, such sums as the
29 Governor and Council shall allow to be paid out of the
30 said sum of fifty thousand dollars.
