STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to regulate the sale of Goods marked "Sterling," "Sterling Silver," "Coin," or "Coin Silver."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. A person who makes or sells, or offers to 2 sell or dispose of, or has in his possession with intent to 3 sell or dispose of, any article of merchandise marked, 4 stamped or branded with the words "sterling," or "ster-5 ling silver," or encased or inclosed in any box, package, 6 cover or wrapper or other thing in or by which the said 7 article is packed, inclosed or otherwise prepared for sale 8 or disposition, having thereon any engraving or printed 9 label, stamp, imprint, mark or trade-mark, indicating or

10 denoting by such marking, stamping, branding, engraving 11 or printing, that such article is silver, sterling silver, or 12 solid silver, unless nine hundred and twenty-five one-thou-13 sandths of the component parts of the metal of which the 14 said article is manufactured are pure silver, shall be deemed 15 guilty of a misdemeanor.

SECT. 2. A person who makes or sells, or offers to sell 2 or dispose of, or has in his possession with intent to sell 3 or dispose of, any article of merchandise marked, stamped 4 or branded with the words "coin," or "coin silver," or 5 encased or inclosed in any box, package, cover or wrapper 6 or other thing in or by which the said article is packed, 7 inclosed or otherwise prepared for sale or disposition, 8 having thereon any engraving or printed label, stamp, 9 imprint, mark or trade-mark, indicating or denoting by 10 such marking, stamping, branding, engraving or printing, 11 that such article is coin or coin silver, unless nine hundred 12 one-thousandths of the component parts of the metal of 13 which the said article is manufactured are pure silver, 14 shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

SECT. 3. Whoever violates the provisions of either of 2 the preceding sections shall forfeit a sum not exceeding one 3 hundred dollars for each offence, the same to be recovered 4 on complaint before any trial justice, police or municipal 5 court in the country in which said offence is committed.
