STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section fifty-one of chapter forty of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter seventy-five of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred ninety-one, relating to Fish and Fisheries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section fifty-one of chapter forty of the Revised Statutes, 2 as amended by chapter seventy-five of the Public Laws of 3 eighteen hundred ninety-one is hereby amended as follows, 4 by inserting after the word "flies" in the seventh line the 5 words, 'artifical minnows or artificial insects' so that said 6 section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 51. Whoever fishes for, takes, catches, kills or 8 destroys any fish with grapnel, spear, trawl, weir, seine,

9 trap, or set lines except when fishing on the ice, and then 10 with not more than five set lines, except in tide waters 11 where such methods are not prohibited, or with any device 12 or in other way than by the ordinary mode of angling with 13 single baited hooks and lines or with artificial flies, artifi-14 cial minnows, or artificial insects, forfeits twenty-ve fidol-15 lars for the offence and ten dollars for each salmon or 16 land-locked salmon and one dollar for each and every 17 other fish so taken, caught, killed or destroyed; and when 18 such prohibited implements or devices are found in use or 19 operation they are forfeit and contraband, and any person 20 finding them in use may destroy them.'
