STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of town of Marion.

Resolved, That the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars 2 be and is hereby appropriated annually for the years 1895 3 and 1896 to assist the town of Marion to maintain roads 4 and bridges in said town, and that the money be expended 5 under the direction of the county commissioners.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The town of Marion, Washington county, on the stage line from Machias to Calais having sixteen miles of road that she is compelled to keep in repair and only thirty-two tax payers, twelve of which only pay a poll tax, find it almost impossible to keep up the road as they should be kept. Therefore we respectfully ask a small appropriation from the State to help relieve us of excessive taxation.
