STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to repeal chapters two hundred and eighty-five and two hundred and eighty-six of the laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, relating to Insurance and Fire Insurance Contracts.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapters two hundred and eighty-five and 2 two hundred and eighty-six of the laws of eighteen hun-3 dred and ninety-three are hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

To the Committee on Insurance, House of Representatives, Augusta, Maine.
