IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED

AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to authorize the Katahdin Pulp and Paper Company to locate, construct and maintain piers and booms in Penobscot river.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Authority is hereby given to the Katahdin 2 Pulp & Paper Company, a corporation duly established 3 by law, and having its place of business at Lincoln in the 4 county of Penobscot, to locate, construct and maintain in 5 the Penobscot river in the town of Lincoln, piers and 6 booms for the purpose of collecting and holding logs and 7 pulp wood for the mill of said company; said piers and 8 booms to be between a line drawn across Penobscot river

9 at the foot of Mattanawcook island, and a line drawn 10 across said river at the outlet of Cambolasse stream; said 11 piers and booms to be so located and constructed as not 12 to interfere with the navigation of said river for logs and 13 lumber, or the free passage of boats from the east shore 14 of the Penobscot river to Mattanawcook island, from the 15 foot of the Indian road, so called, in the town of Lincoln.

SECT. 2. Said company shall, so far as it can, prevent 2 the logs of other parties getting into any of its booms, 3 but if logs of other parties in any considerable quantities 4 should get into any of the booms of said company, said 5 company shall take them out of such boom by the time 6 the rear of the drive in which said logs shall come shall 7 reach the foot of said boom, if possible; in all other cases 8 the company shall be entitled to a reasonable time for the 9 taking of stray logs out of any of their booms and deliv-10 ering the same to the owners after demand for such deliv-11 ery shall be made upon it.
