STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT additional to chapter two hundred and sixty-seven
of the Private and Special Laws of 1863, relating to Little
River Manufacturing Company, and chapter four hundred
and twenty-three, Laws of 1865, relating to the Worumbo
Manufacturing Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. The Worumbo Manufacturing Company is
2 authorized and empowered to locate, construct and main-
3 tain a railroad track and trolley wire over the same, with
4 necessary poles and feeder wires, extending from its works
5 in the village of Lisbon Falls and town of Lisbon to a con-
6 nection with the tracks of the Maine Central Railroad Com-

7 pany, and to operate the same by means of electricity, for
8 the sole purpose of transporting freight between its works
9 and the Maine Central Railroad; provided, that it shall
10 first obtain the consent of the municipal officers of the
11 town of Lisbon, and of the owners of the land through
12 which said track shall be located.

SECT. 2. Should the location secured require a grade
2 crossing of the tracks of the Maine Central Railroad, the
3 manner and conditions of such crossing shall be determined
4 by the Railroad Commissioners in accordance with the pro-
5 visions of section twenty-seven of chapter eighteen of the
6 Revised Statutes, as amended.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
