STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of town of Madawaska

Resolved, That there be appropriated out of any money
2 in the treasury, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to
3 be used in blasting a ledge, Mount Carmel rock, (so-called)
4 situated on the highway road leading to Fort Kent and near
5 the line of the town of Madawaska and Grand Isle, to be
6 expended under the direction of the county commissioners
7 of Aroostook County.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

On the road between Grand Isle and Madawaska, within the limits of the latter town stands Mount Carmel which juts out into and blocks the road so that there is but a very narrow passage for the road between the mountain on the one side and a precipice on the other. It is absolutely necessary that part of the side of the mountain should be blasted. The road as it now is is very dangerous and serious accidents have already occurred. To make this place safe will require a much larger expenditure than the town of Madawaska is able to bear—certainly as much as \$1500. The inhabitants ask that the State contribute \$500 to help accomplish this great work.
