STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACΓ to amend section one hundred and twenty-five of chapter six of the Revised Statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 125 of chapter 6 of the Revised Statutes is 2 hereby amended by inserting in the second line after the 3 word "duties," the words, 'but no compensation or com-4 missions shall be allowed to any collector except upon 5 moneys actually collected by him,' so that said section as 6 amended shall read:

Section 125. When towns choose collectors they may 8 agree what sum shall be allowed for the performance of 9 their duties, but no compensation or commissions shall be 10 allowed to any collector except upon moneys actually

11 collected by him; but if none are chosen, or if those 12 chosen refuse to serve or give the requisite bond, the asses-13 sors may appoint a suitable person to act as constable and 14 collector for the collection of taxes; and if the person so 15 appointed refuses to serve or to give the requisite bond, 16 then they may appoint one of their own board to act as 17 constable and collector for the collection of taxes.'
