AN ACT to amend Section thirteen of Chapter sixty-four  
of the Revised Statutes, relating to Probate of Foreign  
Wills.

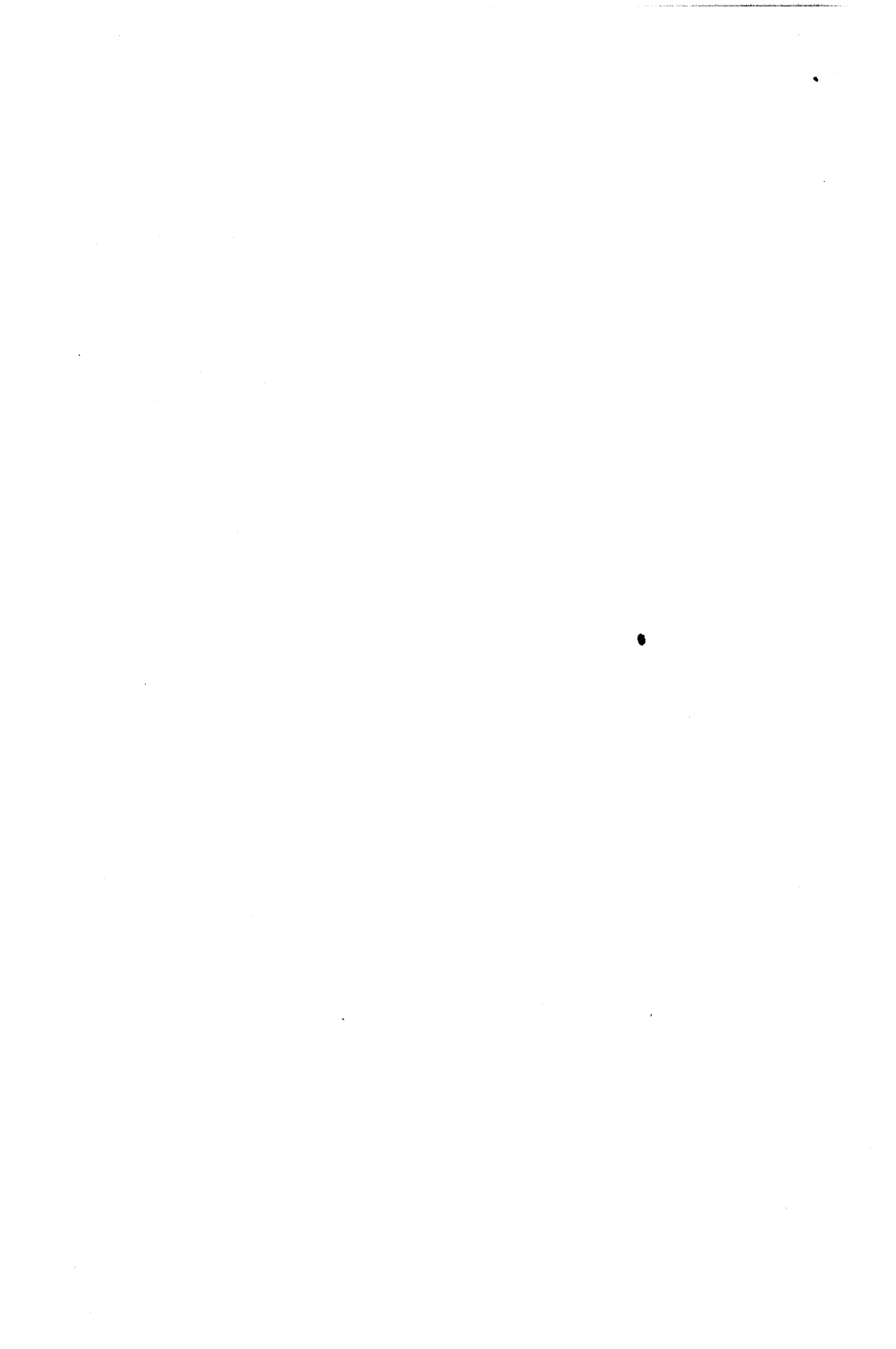

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives  
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section thirteen of chapter sixty-four of the Revised  
2 Statutes is hereby amended in the ninth line thereof, by  
3 substituting for the words "thirty days" the words 'three  
4 weeks,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as  
5 follows:

'Section 13. A will proved and allowed in another  
7 state or country, according to the laws thereof, may be  
8 allowed and recorded in this State in the manner and for  
9 the purposes hereinafter mentioned. A copy of the will

10 and the probate thereof, duly authenticated, shall be pro-  
11 duced by the executor, or by any person interested, to  
12 the judge of probate in any county in which there is  
13 estate, real or personal, on which the will can operate ;  
14 whereupon the judge shall assign a time and place for  
15 hearing, and cause public notice thereof to be given, the  
16 first publication to be three weeks at least before the time  
17 so assigned. After such hearing, if the judge considers  
18 that the instrument should be allowed in this State as the  
19 will of the deceased, he shall order the copy to be filed  
20 and recorded.'
