STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Milo.

Resolved, That there be paid by the treasurer of state,
2 out of the school funds of the current year, to the town of
3 Milo, the sum of two hundred and twenty-five dollars and
4 four cents, (\$225.00) it being a balance equitably due said
5 town as its proportion of the school funds for the year
6 eighteen hundred and ninety-three.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The number of scholars in the town of Milo in the year 1890, between the ages of four and twenty-one years of age, as returned to the state superintendent of schools, by the supervisor of schools of Milo was 355; for the year 1891, 337; for the year 1892, 333; for the year 1893 the true number as shown by the agent's census returns made to the supervisor now on file was 314, but by a clerical error of the supervisor in making his return to the state superintendent the number 217 was returned, or 97 less than the true number whereby the town of Milo received \$225.04 less than the sum equitably due said town.

In A. D. 1894 the number of scholars returned to the state superintendent from the town of Milo was 318.

The affidavit of the supervisor of schools for said town of Milo for the year 1893 is hereunto annexed and made a part of this statement of facts.

FOXCROFT, Maine, January 28, 1895.

To Geo. W. Howe, Esq., Member House of Representatives :

This certifies that I, A. H. Stanhope, now of Foxcroft, Maine, was, April 1, 1893, a resident of Milo, Maine, and supervisor of schools in said Milo. That as such supervisor I made a true and perfect list of all scholars in said Milo between the ages of four and twenty-one years as required by law. That by reference to papers I now find that the number of scholars between said ages in said Milo, April 1, 1893, was three hundred and fourteen, (314) instead of two hundred and seventeen as was returned by me to the state superintendent for the year 1893. That the mistake was made by me in some manner which I cannot now account for.
