STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of roads in Indian Township,
Washington County.

Resolved, That the sum of six hundred dollars be and is
2 hereby appropriated for repairs of roads and bridges in the
3 Indian township, Washington county, for the year eighteen
4 hundred and ninety-five, and six hundred dollars for the
5 year eighteen hundred and ninety-six. The same to be
6 expended under the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The State has twelve miles of road in the Indian township, to keep in repair. The road is in bad condition; there are two bridges of about thirty feet each to build over, and one-half of the Princeton bridge to repair. The bushes have not been cut along said road for years and have grown to that size they must be cut.
