## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to set off the southwest portion of the town of Gouldsboro and Incorporate the town of Winter Harbor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. All that part of the town of Gouldsboro 2 lying westerly and southerly of the following described 3 lines, namely: Beginning at a point near the head of 4 Wansquague harbor at the southeast corner bound of land 5 occupied by Wilson Lindsey and thence running south 6 eighty-five degrees west, by said Lindsey's southerly line 7 and line of the forty-six acre lot shown upon the plan of 8 the town of Gouldsboro, thirty-six rods to the southwest 9 corner bound of said lot; thence north five degrees west, 10 by the easterly line of said lot, one hundred and eighty-11 four rods to the northwest corner thereof; thence north

12 eighty-five degrees east twenty rods to the southwest cor-13 ner bound of the thirty acre lot; thence north five degrees 14 west, by the westerly line of the last mentioned lot, forty-15 two and three-fourths rods to the south-west corner bound 16 of the forty-one and three-fourths acre lot; thence north 17 fifteen degrees west, by the westerly line of the last men-18 tioned lot and the thirty-six acre lot, one hundred and thirty 19 rods to lot number thirteen; thence south seventy-eight 20 degrees west, by the southerly line of lot number thirteen. 21 65 rods to the southwest corner bound thereof; thence north 22 fourteen degrees west, by the westerly line of lot number 23 thirteen, eighty-six and one-half rods to the northwest 24 corner bound thereof; thence north twelve degrees west 25 thirty rods to the southwest corner bound of the one hun-26 dred acre lot; thence north five degrees west, by the 27 westerly line of the last mentioned lot, eighty-six and one-28 half rods to the northwest corner bound thereof; thence 29 north eighty-five degrees east one hundred and twenty 30 rods to the southwest corner of lot marked "I;" thence 31 north five degrees west by the westerly line of lots marked 32 "I," "H," "G," "F," "E," "D," "C," and "B" three 33 hundred and forty-three rods to the northwest corner 34 bound of said lot "B;" thence north eighty-five degrees 35 east seven rods to the southwest corner bound of the pub-36 lic school lot; thence north five degrees west, by the 37 westerly line of said public school lot four hundred rods 38 to the south line of the public ministerial lot, being the 39 south line of Jones' quarter, as shown upon the plan of 40 the town of Gouldsboro as are also all the other lots herein 41 referred to; thence south eighty-five degree west by said 42 south line of Jones' quarter eight hundred and sixty-two 43 rods to the waters of Frenchman's Bay, together with all 44 the islands lying south of a production of said south line 45 of Jones' quarter upon the waters of said bay and west of 46 a production of the westerly line of said public school lot 47 extended to Wansquague harbor and upon the waters of 48 said bay, excepting, however, all those islands known as 49 the Porcupine islands and to include also all of Jordan's 50 and Yellow islands, together with the inhabitants thereof, 51 is incorporated into a separate town by the name of Win-52 ter Harbor, and said town of Winter Harbor is hereby 53 invested with all the powers and privileges and subject to 54 all the duties and obligations incident to other towns of 55 the state.

- SECT. 2. The several inhabitants of the town of Winter 2 Harbor shall be holden to pay all taxes which have been 3 legally assessed upon them by the town of Gouldsboro, 4 and the several collectors of taxes for said town of Goulds-5 boro are hereby authorized and required to collect and 6 pay all taxes to them already committed according to 7 their respective warrants. All moneys now in the treas-8 ury of said town of Gouldsboro, and all sums which shall 9 hereafter be received from taxes heretofore assessed, shall 10 be applied to the several purposes for which they were 11 raised, and in case of any excess, said excess shall be 12 applied by the treasurer of Gouldsboro in payment of the 13 indebtedness of said town of Gouldsboro.
- SECT. 3. The existing liabilities of the town of Goulds-2 boro shall be divided as follows: The town debt, if any, 3 shall be borne by said towns in proportion to the valuation 4 of their respective territories, as taken by the asse sors in 5 April, eighteen hundred ninety-four. All paupers, now 6 supported or aided by the town of Gouldsboro, including

7 those in the Maine insane hospital, and all persons that 8 may hereafter fall in distress or become paupers, shall, 9 after the approval of this Act, be maintained and supported 10 by the town in whose territory they resided when they 11 became paupers and in whose territory their settlements 12 may be established, under the laws of the State, when 13 falling in distress or becoming paupers. Each town shall 14 henceforth bear all expenses for the support of schools 15 and the care and maintenance of all roads and bridges 16 within its respective limits.

SECT. 4. The school houses and lots, books, apparatus 2 and other school appliances, owned by the town of Goulds-3 boro under the law of 1893 abolishing the school district 4 system, shall, hereafter, belong to the town in whose 5 territory they are located.

All other property of the town of Gouldsboro, both real 7 and personal, including the town house and lot, town 8 common or landing, road machines, and the books and 9 records, shall belong to said town of Gouldsboro.

- SECT. 5. The records and papers of the town of 2 Gouldsboro shall hereafter be retained by said town of 3 Gouldsboro, and each town shall have access to same.
- SECT. 6. Said town of Winter Harbor is hereby 2 authorized, at a town meeting legally called therefor, to 3 enter into a contract with any duly organized water 4 company, for the supply of water for all domestic, sanitary, 5 municipal and commercial purposes, and for such exemp-6 tion from public burden as may be agreed upon, and such 7 contract when made shall be legal and binding upon all 8 parties thereto.
- SECT. 7. Until a new apportionment of the state shall 2 be made, the town of Gouldsboro and the town of Winter

3 Harbor shall remain in the same respective district with 4 which the town of Gouldsboro is now classed.

SECT. 8. Any justice of the peace in the county of 2 Hancock may issue his warrant to any legal voter in the 3 town of Winter Harbor directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof to meet at a time and place specified in said 5 warrant, giving at least seven days notice therefor, for the 6 choice of town officers, and to transact such business as 7 towns are authorized to do.

Sect. 9. This act shall take effect when approved.
