STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Monmouth Academy.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars yearly,
2 for two years be and hereby is appropriated to Monmouth
3 academy, an institution of learning located in the town of
4 Monmouth, in the county of Kennebec.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This academy has been doing a noble work since 1810. It has a good, commodious brick building with laboratory and library. It is situated in Kennebec county, in the western part of the county. It has three terms of thirteen weeks yearly; average number of scholars, fifty. It is a fitting school for colleges as well as affording an opportunity to the youth of all that section to procure a good education which they otherwise could not obtain. Scholars attend from three counties, Kennebec, Franklin and Androscoggin. The town of Monmouth for ten years, and will continue to do so yearly, raised \$400 to be expended by the institution. This small stipend asked of the State will enable it to keep its doors open, otherwise it will have to be closed. It is supplying a pressing need in this part of the State. It is not a denominational institution. It is situated in the midst of a farming community, here the boys and girls of farmers are enabled to procure a good education. We feel sure that no money of the State is expended in educational matters, better appreciated or that does more good. No money is wasted, every dollar counts for good.
