STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to prevent the destruction of smelts in the bays harbors and coves in the town of Surry.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from 2 taking any smelts by means of purse or by drag seines or 3 weirs, or in any other manner, except with hook and line, 4 in any bay, harbor or cove, in the town of Surry in the 5 county of Hancock, commencing at Weymouth point and 6 running S. S. W. course five miles to Newberry Neck, and 7 from Newberry Neck a north and south course two and 8 one-half miles past Jud's island to the Bluehill line.

SECT. 2. Whoever shall violate the provisions of this 2 act, shall on conviction of the same before any municipal 3 court or trial justice of said county of Hancock be punished 4 by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than twenty 5 dollars or imprisonment in the county jail for a term not 6 less than ten days, and imprisoned in said jail for same 7 time for non-payment of said fine.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
