**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.**

AN ACT to prevent the destruction of smelts in the bays
harbors and coves in the town of Surry.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from
2 taking any smelts by means of purse or by drag seines or
3 weirs, or in any other manner, except with hook and line,
4 in any bay, harbor or cove, in the town of Surry in the
5 county of Hancock, commencing at Weymouth point and
6 running S. S. W. course five miles to Newberry Neck, and
7 from Newberry Neck a north and south course two and
8 one-half miles past Jud's island to the Bluehill line.

SECT. 2. Whoever shall violate the provisions of this
2 act, shall on conviction of the same before any municipal
3 court or trial justice of said county of Hancock be punished
4 by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than twenty
5 dollars or imprisonment in the county jail for a term not
6 less than ten days, and imprisoned in said jail for same
7 time for non-payment of said fine.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
