STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT additional to chapter thirty-nine of the Revised Statutes, relating to receptacles for kerosene, refined petroleum, gasoline, or other burning or illuminating oils or fluids.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. All persons or corporations engaged in the 2 sale of kerosene, refined petroleum, gasoline, or other 3 burning or illuminating oils or fluids, in cans of a capacity 4 of not less than five gallous, with their names, or other 5 marks or devices branded, stamped, engraved, etched, 6 impressed or otherwise produced upon such cans or any-

7 thing connected therewith or appertaining thereto, may 8 file in the office of the town or city clerk in which their 9 principal place of business is situated, a description of the 10 names and marks aforesaid, used by them, and cause the 11 same to be published once a week for three successive 12 weeks, in any weekly paper published in the county in 13 which said notice may have been filed as aforesaid.

SECT. 2. Whoever knowingly and wilfully, without the 2 written consent of the owner, uses, buys, sells, fills or 3 traffics in any such can so marked as aforesaid, or defaces, 4 covers up or obliterates the names, marks or devices thereon, 5 with intent to use, fill, sell, buy, dispose of or traffic therein, 6 or to convert the same to his own use, shall, on complaint, 7 be punished by a fine of not more than twenty dollars.
