STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of William H. Holmes of Augusta.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the State treasury 2 to William H. Holmes of Augusta, the sum of one hundred 3 dollars, amount due him as a bounty under an act of 1863, 4 Chapter 218, Public Laws of Maine for said year.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The undersigned enlisted at Houlton, Maine, on the 11th day of March, 1862, in the 17th United States infantry to serve three years; joined the regiment at Harringson's Landing, Va., was severely wounded at the battle of Fredericksburg in the right shoulder, and was discharged at Stanton General Hospital, Washington, D. C., on the 3d day of February, 1863; re-enlisted at Portland, Me., in the Veteran Reserve Corps, on the 27th day of November, 1863, to serve through the war; was sent to Augusta to fill out the quota of Augusta and was discharged September 29, 1864, at Augusta, Me. Undersigned has never received the said bounty of one hundred dollars allowed under said act of 1863, and therefore petitions and requests that the same may be paid him by the State.
