STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Oakfield Plantation.

Resolved, That the sum of six hundred twenty dollars and 2 nineteen cents be, and is, hereby appropriated to be paid 3 to the treasurer of Oakfield Plantation to reimburse said 4 plantation, for money expended for the support of state 5 paupers during the years 1891, 1892 and 1893.

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STATEMENT OF FACTS.

We, the undersigned, hereby certify that the said John Corliss, James Robb and David Davis and wife were having help from the state prior to the time that we began to support them in July, 1891; also have had help from the state since. Benjamin Wilcox and Charles Murphy, we are not positive, but think they have had help from the state. Neal Farren and Alfred Snow were transient men, had no residence in this state were laboring on the B. & A. R. R. were taken suddenly ill and had no means of support so we were obliged to relieve them. Nearly all paid for the support of the above paupers was paid for board by the week.

Paid by the plantation of Oakfield for the support of state paupers from July 6, 1891, to March 27, 1893; paid for the support of John Corliss from July 23, 1891, to December 7, 1891, \$39.72; paid for the support of James Robb from July 16, 1891, to March 27, 1893, \$125.89; paid for the support of David Davis and wife from July 6, 1891, to March 27, 1893, \$336.14; paid for the support of Alfred Snow in September and October, 1892, \$22.50; paid for the support of Neal Farren in October, November and December, 1892, \$35.17; paid for the support of Benjamin Wilcox from July 10, 1891, to March 26, 1892, \$35.72; supplies furnished Charles Murphy from September 10, 1891, to June 9, 1892, \$25.05. Total, \$620.19.
