STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to provide for the Investigation of the causes of Fires, and the Publication of Statistics relating to the same.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. When property is destroyed by fire, it 2 shall be the duty of the board of aldermen in cities and of

3 selectmen in towns, to make investigation of the cause,

4 circumstances, and origin thereof, and especially to exam-

5 ine whether it was the result of carelessness or of design.

6 The investigation shall be commenced within six days of

7 the occurrence of the fire, not including the Lord's day.

8 They shall have the powers vested in trial justices to com-

9 pel the attendance of witnesses to testify before them 10 upon such inquest.

- SECT. 2. They shall present to the city or town clerk, 2 for record by him in a book provided by the insurance 3 commissioner, a written statement of all the facts relating 4 to the cause of such fire, the kind, value, and ownership of 5 property destroyed, and of such other particulars as may 6 be called for in the form provided, and of any other facts 7 which to them seem pertinent; and such record shall be 8 made within two weeks of the occurrence of the fire.
- SECT. 3. The clerk shall make a transcript of such fire 2 record upon a blank form provided by the insurance com-3 missioner, for each six months preceding, and forward the 4 same to the insurance commissioner within fifteen days 5 from the first day of July and the first day of January in 6 each year. He shall also transmit to the insurance com-7 missioner at any time, upon his request, a copy of the 8 record as to any particular fire, or any facts concerning it.
- SECT. 4. Any officer neglecting or refusing to perform 2 any duty required of him by the provisions of this act shall 3 be fined not exceeding two hundred dollars.
- SECT. 5. The insurance commissioner shall classify and 2 tabulate the statistics so obtained and shall publish them in 3 his annual report.
