STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT additional to Chapter 128 of the Revised Statutes, relating to eggs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Whoever, by himself or his agent, sells or offers for sale 2 eggs that have been in cold storage or limed, or that have 3 been preserved in any manner and are not what are usually 4 denominated fresh eggs, without notice to the purchaser or 5 purchasers, knowingly and with intent to deceive, shall be 6 punished by imprisonment not exceeding thirty days or by 7 fine not exceeding one hundred dollars.
