

RESOLVE in favor of the town of Friendship.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury to
2 the town of Friendship, the sum of eight hundred dollars ;

4 Henry Simmons, a state pauper.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The undersigned, selectmen of the town of Friendship respectfully represent that one, Henry Simmons, a State pauper, has for a period of some twenty years or more, been supported by the town of Friendship and that the town has never been re-imbursed for any portion of the sum expended for the support of said pauper, which sum now amounts to some \$5,000. The undersigned respectfully request the legislature to allow such sum as upon investigation will appear to be just and equitable.
