STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of free Public Libraries.

Resolved, that the sum of six hundred dollars be and
2 hereby is appropriated for deficiencies for the years 1893
3 and 1894 ; also the sum of five hundred dollars for the
4 year 1895 ; and also the sum of four hundred dollars for
5 the year 1896 for the purpose of supplying books to free
6 public libraries established in towns of less than fifteen
7 hundred inhabitants, in conformity to sections five and
8 six, chapter two hundred and forty-two of the public laws
9 of 1893.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The following towns of less than fifteen hundred inhabitants have established free public libraries and are entitled to books from the State to the amount of one hundred dollars each, under section five of chapter 242 of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, New Sharon, New Gloucester, Phillips, Palmyra, Orono, Oxford.
