STATE OF MAINE.

AMENDMENT "A" TO HOUSE DOCUMENT No. 110

Entitled: "An Act to divide the town of Sullivan and incorporate the town of Sorrento."

Section three of said act is hereby amended by striking
2 out the whole of said section after the figure "3" in the
3 first line and inserting in place thereof the following
4 words: 'The town debt, if any, and the state and county
5 tax to be assessed against the town of Sullivan for the
6 years 1895 and 1896, shall be borne by said towns in
7 proportion to the valuation of their respective territories,
8 as taken by the assessors in April, 1894. All paupers
9 now supported or aided by the town of Sullivan, includ-
10 ing the insane paupers, if any, shall be maintained and

11 supported by said towns in proportion to the valuation of
12 their respective territories as taken by the assessors in
13 April, 1894. And all persons that may hereafter fall in
14 distress or become paupers, shall after the approval of this
15 act, be maintained and supported by the town in whose
16 territory they resided when they became paupers and in
17 whose territory their settlements may be established under
18 the laws of the state. The school-houses and lots and
19 other school property shall belong to the town in whose
20 territory they are situated. All other town property,
21 including the town house and lot shall belong to the town
22 of Sullivan. Until a new apportionment of the state
23 shall be made, said towns shall remain in the same repre-
24 sentative district with which the town of Sullivan is now
25 classed.' So that said section as amended shall read as
26 follows :

‘Section 3. The town debt, if any, and the state and
28 county tax to be assessed against the town of Sullivan for
29 the years 1895 and 1896, shall be borne by said towns in
30 proportion to the valuation of their respective territories,
31 as taken by the assessors in April, 1894. All paupers
32 now supported or aided by the town of Sullivan, including
33 the insane papers, if any, shall be maintained and sup-
34 ported by said towns in proportion to the valuation of
35 their respective territories as taken by the assessors in
36 April, 1894. And all persons that may hereafter fall in
37 distress or become paupers, shall after the approval of
38 this Act, be maintained and supported by the town in

39 whose territory they resided when they became paupers
40 and in whose territory their settlements may be estab-
41 lished under the laws of the state. The school houses and
42 lots and other school property shall belong to the town in
43 whose territory they are situated. All other town
44 property including the town house and lot shall belong to
45 the town of Sullivan. Until a new apportionment of the
46 state shall be made, said towns shall remain in the same
47 representative district with which the town of Sullivan is
48 now classed.
