TO ACCOMPANY HOUSE DOCUMENT No. 107.

Wilton Academy was organized in 1866; commenced operation in 1867, and since that time has been kept in operation and has done a noble work, yet somewhat crippled for want of funds, as it has no means of support except tuition, and from this source alone is unable to maintain its present grade of school, furnishing courses in Higher English, Preparatory and Commercial courses. It has received from the state \$500 per year during the past six years, which expired in 1894. Since receiving this aid it has raised by subscription about \$3,000.00, which has been expended in enlarging and repairing the building, so that now we have a large and convenient building, and we feel that no institution in the state can make a better showing for judicious use of their funds received from either state or individuals, than can Wilton Academy; and this appropriation is absolutely necessary for its support.
