STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section 112 of chapter 11 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 37 of the Public Laws of 1891; and to repeal section 3 of chapter 82 of Public Laws of 1887, as amended by chapter 272 of the Public Laws of 1893, relating to Normal Schools, and the Madawaska Training School.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

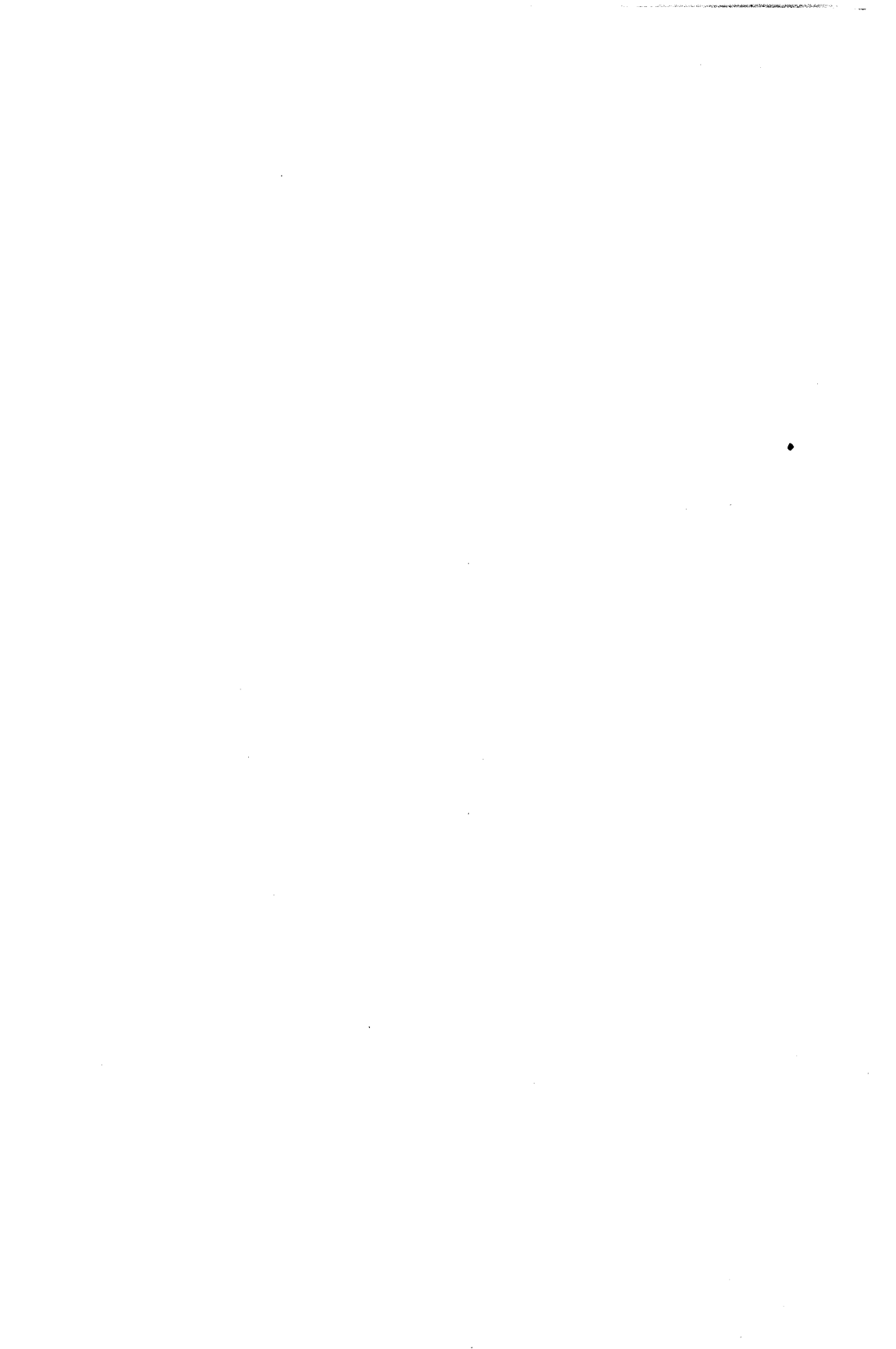
SECTION 1. Section 112 of chapter 11 of the Revised 2 Statutes, as amended by chapter 37 of the Public Laws 3 of 1891, is hereby amended by inserting in the first line 4 thereof, after the word "schools" the words 'and Mada- 5 waska Training School,' and by inserting in place of the

6 words "twenty-four" in the same line, the word 'thirty,'
7 so that said section shall read as follows :

'Section 112. For the support of the three Normal
9 Schools and the Madawaska Training School, thirty thou-
10 sand dollars is annually appropriated, to be expended
11 under the direction of said trustees, which sum the treas-
12 urer of state shall deduct for said purpose from any school
13 money raised for the support of common schools. The
14 governor and council may from time to time, as they
15 think proper, draw warrants therefor on said treasurer in
16 favor of said trustees.'

SECT. 2. Section three of chapter 82 of the Public
2 Laws of 1887, as amended by chapter 272 of the Public
3 Laws of 1893 is hereby repealed.

SECT. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent here-
2 with, are hereby repealed.
