STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to incorporate the Arctic Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. William H. Hanson, Charles A. Coleman, 2 E. C. Maloney, G. S. Baker and Joseph Gilbert, their 3 associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a 4 body politic by the name of the Arctic Telephone and 5 Telegraph Company, with all the rights, powers and privi-6 leges, and subject to all the duties and obligations granted 7 and prescribed by the general laws of this state relating to 8 corporations. Said corporation shall have the right to 9 locate, construct, maintain, and operate lines of telephone 10 and telegraph from the station of the Canadian Pacific 11 Railway at Jackman, through Jackman, Moose river, Den-

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12 nistown and Sandy Bay Plantations, along by or near the13 Canada road (so-called) to the line between Canada and14 the State of Maine.

SECT. 2. Said company shall have the right within the 2 limits aforesaid, to locate, construct and maintain its lines 3 upon and along any public way, bridge, or private lands, 4 but in such manner as not to incommode or endanger the 5 customary use of such way, road or bridge, with the right 6 to cut down trees, remove obstacles where necessary within 7 the limits aforesaid, except ornamental, fruit or shade trees, 8 and with the power to establish and collect tolls on said 9 line.

SECT. 3. If the land of any individual or corporation 2 is taken under this act and the parties cannot agree on the 3 damages occasioned thereby, they shall be estimated, 4 secured and paid in the manner provided in case of land 5 taken for railroads.

SECT. 4. Said corporation is hereby authorized to con-2 nect its lines with those of any other company, or to sell 3 or lease its line, either before or after its completion, to 4 any other telephone or telegraph company upon such terms 5 as may be mutually agreed upon, which sale or lease shall 6 be binding upon the parties, or to purchase or lease any 7 other line or lines of telegraph or telephone, upon such 8 terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed upon.

SECT. 5. The amount of the capital stock shall be fixed 2 by vote of the corporation, but not to exceed the amount 3 that may from time to time be necessary for the purposes 4 herein specified, but not to exceed ten thousand dollars, 5 and said corporation may purchase, hold, sell and convey 6 real estate and personal property necessary for the purposes 7 contemplated in this charter.

ARCTIC TELEPHONE COMPANY.

SECT. 6. Any one of the corporators named in this act 2 may call the first meeting of this company, by mailing a 3 written notice to each of the other corporators, seven days 4 at least before the day of meeting, naming the time, place 5 and purposes of such meeting; and at such meeting a presi-6 dent, secretary, treasurer and directors may be chosen, 7 by-laws adopted, and any corporate business transacted.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect when approved.
