STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the road in Washington Plantation, so called, and Perkins Plantation, so called, in Franklin County.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of two hundred dollars (\$200) to be expended under
3 the direction of the county commissioners of Franklin
4 county, in repairing the road leading from Wilton to
5 Weld through Washington plantation, so called, and Per-
6 kins plantation, so called, in said plantations in Franklin
7 county. But said money shall not be paid until said com-
8 missioners have produced satisfactory evidence to the gov-
9 ernor and council that they have raised and expended a
10 like sum on said road.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The stage road from Wilton to Weld runs through Washington and Perkins plantations. The distance through said plantations is about eight miles. Washington plantation has not been organized for many years and Perkins plantation has no legal organization for road purposes. That it is impossible for said plantations to keep the roads in proper repair. That there is much travel over said road, it being the main thoroughfare from Weld to the railroad. Therefore we respectfully ask a small appropriation from the State to help repair said road.
