## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section one of chapter one hundred and forty-four of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter ten of the Public Laws of 1895, relating to State Pensions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter one hundred and 2 forty-four of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 3 ten of the Public Laws of 1895, approved February 5, 4 1895, is hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. Any person who has served by enlistment in 2 the army or navy of the United States in the war of eigh-3 teen hundred and sixty-one, on the quota of Maine, and 4 any person not on the quota of Maine, who has served in

5 the army or navy of the United States in said war, and 6 who was a resident of this state at date of enlistment, and 7 at time of making application for pension shall have been 8 a resident of the state at least five years, and who is 9 unable from his own resources and the United States pen-10 sion, to obtain a livelihood for himself and those depend-11 ent upon him, shall be entitled to a pension from the state 12 of Maine, not exceeding eight dollars a month, provided 13 he has been honorably discharged from said service, no 14 such pension to be paid by this state to persons residing 15 in other states.
