

STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of a road in Dallas Plantation.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the 2 sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, to be expended under 3 the direction of the county commissioners of Franklin 4 county, in completing a road in Dallas plantation, between 5 Rangeley and Dead River station.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This is a road laid out by the county commissioners in 1892, five miles in length, leading from Rangeley to Dead river station in Franklin county and connecting with the county road at said Dead river station leading to the county road in Coplin plantation. Three miles of this road has been built, two miles remains to be completed, which is a very hard, rocky piece of road to build, it has been grubed out for winter travel and buckboards are used in summer, it is estimated that it will cost two thousand dollars to complete the road, and the inhabitants of Rangeley and vicinity will aid in completing the same. Said road will be of great public convenience in connecting the Dead river and Rangeley regions, in that it would accommodate a large number of summer visitors, as well as the inhabitants of Franklin county.
