STATE OF MAINE.

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.**

AN ACT to amend section thirty-one of chapter forty of the Revised Statutes as amended by chapter two hundred and sixty of the Public Laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-five, as amended by chapter seventy-seven of the Public Laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, as amended by chapter twenty-seven of the Public Laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 31 of chapter 40 of the Revised Statutes as
2 amended by chapter 260 of the Public Laws of 1885, as
3 amended by chapter 77 of the Public Laws of 1887, as
4 amended by chapter 27 of the Public Laws of 1891, is
5 hereby amended by striking out in the eighth line the

6 word “Bluehill,” so that said section as amended shall
7 read as follows :

‘Section 31. The following waters and their tributaries
9 are exempt from the provisions relating to migratory
10 fishes and the supervision of the fishways by the commis-
11 sioners, that is to say, Royall’s river in North Yarmouth,
12 Sewall’s pond or its outlet in Arrowsic, so much of the
13 waters of the Damariscotta river as are west of the rail-
14 road bridge near Damariscotta Mills, all waters ‘in Vinal-
15 haven, Tremont, Mount Desert, Eden, Franklin and Sul-
16 livan, Tunk river in Steuben, Pleasant river in Washing-
17 ton county, East Machias river and the Eastern Penobscot
18 river in Orland.’
