STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section four of chapter 256, Public Laws of Maine, 1893, entitled "An Act to regulate the sale and analysis of Commercial Fertilizers."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section four of chapter 256, Public Laws of Maine, 2 1893, is hereby amended by striking out the word "five" 3 after the words "as follows" in the fifth line of said section, and inserting in place thereof the word "ten," and by 5 striking out the word "thirty" after the word "which" in 6 the eighth line of said section, and inserting in place

7 thereof the word 'ten,' so that said section, as amended, 8 shall read as follows:

'Section 4. Any manufacturer, importer, agent or seller 10 of any commercial fertilizer, who shall deposit with the

11 director of the Maine Experiment Station a sample or 12 samples of fertilizer under the provisions of section two of 13 this act, shall pay annually to said director an analysis fee 14 as follows: Ten dollars for the phosphoric acid and five 15 dollars each for the nitrogen and potash, contained or said 16 to be contained in the fertilizer, this fee to be assessed on 17 any brand of which thirty tons or more are sold in the 18 state, and upon receipt of such fee and of the certified 19 statement named in section two of this act, said director 20 shall issue a certificate of compliance with this act. 21 Whenever the manufacturer or importer of a fertilizer 22 shall have filed the statement made in section two of this 23 act and paid the analysis fee, no agent or seller of said 24 manufacturer, importer or shipper shall be required to file 25 such statement or pay such fee. The analysis fees re-26 ceived by said director shall be paid immediately by him 27 into the treasury of said experiment station.

'Section six of chapter 256, Public Laws of Maine, 1893, 29 is also amended by inserting after the word "sample" in 30 the third line of said section, the words 'taken in the 31 manner hereinafter prescribed,' and also by striking out 32 the words "reported to the person or persons requesting 33 the analysis, and shall also be" in the twenty-sixth line of 34 said section, so that said section, as amended, shall read 35 as follows:

'Section 6. The director of the Maine Experiment 37 Station shall annually analyze, or cause to be analyzed, at 38 least one sample taken in the manner hereinafter pre-39 scribed, of every fertilizer sold or offered for sale under 40 the provisions of this act. Said director is hereby author-41 ized and directed in person or by deputy to take a sam-42 ple, not exceeding two pounds in weight, for said analysis,

43 from any lot or package of fertilizer or any material used 44 for manurial purposes which may be in the possession of 45 any manufacturer, importer, agent or dealer in this state; 46 but said sample shall be drawn in the presence of 47 said party or parties in interest, or their represen-48 tatives, and taken from a parcel or a number of 49 packages which shall not be less than ten per cent of 50 the whole lot sampled, and shall be thoroughly mixed and 51 then divided into two equal samples and placed in glass 52 vessels and carefully sealed and a label placed on each, 53 stating the name or brand of the fertilizer or material 54 sampled, the name of the party from whose stock the 55 sample was drawn and the time and place of drawing, and 56 said label shall also be signed by the director or his deputy, 57 and by the party or parties in interest or their represen-58 tative at the drawing and sealing of said samples; one of 59 said duplicate samples shall be retained by the director 60 and the other by the party whose stock was sampled: and 61 the sample or samples retained by the director shall be 62 for comparison with the certified statement named in sec-63 tion two of this act. The result of analysis of the sample 64 or samples so procured shall be published in a report or 65 bulletin within reasonable time.'
