
AN ACT to amend chapter twenty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of 1869, entitled "An Act to incorporate the town of Ellsworth into a city."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section five of chapter twenty-nine of the 2 Private and Special Laws of Maine for the year 1869, 3 entitled "An Act to incorporate the town of Ellsworth 4 into a city," is hereby amended by striking out the whole 5 of said section 5 of said act, and inserting in place thereof 6 the following:

'Section 5. Every law, act, ordinance, resolve or order 8 of the board of mayor and aldermen, excepting rules and 9 orders of a parliamentary character, shall be presented to 10 the mayor. If not approved by him he shall return it with 11 his objections, at the next stated session of said board of 12 mayor and aldermen, which shall enter the objections 13 at large on its journal and proceed to reconsider the same. 14 If, upon such reconsideration, it shall be passed by a vote 15 of two-thirds of all the members of said board it shall have 16 the same force as if approved by the mayor. In case of a 17 vacancy in the mayor's office, this section shall not apply 18 to any act of said board.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
