STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to provide for the schooling of Children in Unincorporated Townships.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Wherever in any unincorporated township
2 in this state there shall be two or more children between
3 the ages of four and twenty-one years residing within
4 three miles of a school in any adjoining town or planta-
5 tion, the supervisor of schools in said adjoining town or
6 plantation shall make enumeration of said children and
7 include the number thereof in the number returned to the
8 state superintendent of common schools with their place

9 of residence in accordance with section eighty-eight of
10 chapter eleven of the Revised Statutes; and thereupon
11 said children shall have the same right in the nearest school
12 in said town or plantation as children resident in said town
13 or plantation.

SECT. 2. The treasurer of state shall pay to the treas-
2 urer of the town or plantation where said children have
3 been enumerated, the interest on reserved land fund of said
4 township, but not exceeding three dollars for each scholar
5 so enumerated from said unincorporated township.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon approval.
