STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to regulate the taking of Clams in the Towns of Yarmouth and Cumberland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Whoever, within the limits of the towns 2 of Yarmouth and Cumberland takes clams between the 3 fifteenth day of June and the fifteenth day of September 4 of each year, shall, for each offence, be fined not more 5 than ten dollars or imprisoned not more than thirty days, 6 or both.

Sect. 2. The foregoing section shall not apply to the 2 taking of clams by any inhabitant of Yarmouth, Cumber-

- 3 land and North Yarmouth, or any transient person therein, 4 for the consumption of himself or family, nor shall it 5 interfere with any law relating to the taking of shell 6 fish by fishermen for bait, nor shall it apply to hotel 7 keepers taking clams for the use of their hotels.
- SECT. 3. No vote shall be passed or municipal regu-2 lations made by the towns of Yarmouth, Cumberland and 3 North Yarmouth, or either of them, prohibiting the tak-4 ing of clams within the limits of the towns of Yarmouth 5 and Cumberland by residents or inhabitants of the towns 6 of Yarmouth, Cumberland and North Yarmouth.
