STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to amend Section fifty-nine of Chapter sixty-four
of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter two hun-
dred and thirty-four of the Public Laws of 1893 relating
to the powers and duties of Executors and Administrators.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section fifty-nine of chapter sixty-four of the Revised
2 Statutes as amended by chapter two hundred and thirty-
3 four of the Public Laws of 1893, is hereby amended by
4 inserting after the word "for" in the third line the words,
5 'the purchasing of a suitable burial lot and for,' and by
6 striking out the words in the fourth line "it shall not
7 exceed twenty dollars" and inserting instead the words,

8 'the sum shall be fixed by the judge of probate.' So that
9 said section as amended shall read as follows :

‘Section 59. In the settlement of the accounts of exec-
11 utors and administrators, the judge may allow a reasona-
12 ble sum for the purchasing of a suitable burial lot and for
13 the erection of monuments or grave stones ; but, in insol-
14 vent estates the sum shall be fixed by the judge of pro-
15 bate. And on petition of any person interested the judge
16 of probate may also allow a reasonable sum for the erec-
17 tion of grave stones, for funeral expenses and expenses of
18 last sickness of the widow of the deceased, provided, she
19 dies before the final settlement of her husband's estate
20 and her estate is insufficient for the above purposes.’
