STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED
AND NINETY-FIVE,

AN ACT to prohibit the taking of fish in Little Tunk pond,
so called, in Plantation Number seven, Hancock County,
Maine.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECTION 1. No person shall take, fish for, kill or des-
2 troy any fish in Little Tunk pond, so called, situated in
3 Plantation Number 7, Hancock county, Maine, at any time
4 within four years from the approval of this act.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions
2 of this act, shall pay a fine of ten dollars (\$10.00) and
3 shall further pay the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) for each
4 and every fish so taken, caught, killed or destroyed, to be
5 recovered by complaint before any trial justice or munic-
6 pal court.
