STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND NINETY-FIVE.

AN ACT to prohibit the taking of fish in Little Tunk pond, so called, in Plantation Number seven, Hancock County, Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall take, fish for, kill or des-2 troy any fish in Little Tunk pond, so called, situated in 3 Plantation Number 7, Hancock county, Maine, at any time 4 within four years from the approval of this act.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions 2 of this act, shall pay a fine of ten dollars (\$10.00) and 3 shall further pay the sum of one dollar (\$1.00) for each 4 and every fish so taken, caught, killed or destroyed, to be 5 recovered by complaint before any trial justice or munici-6 pal court.
